Our Goal: Once again this year we wish to present a show of smaller scale works, so we can display more work from more artists. We ask that all 2D artists limit their entries to the following sizes:

18 x 24 (1 entry only), **11 x 14** (2 entries), **8 x 10** (3 entries)
You may enter an 8 x 10 as a second entry with your 11 x 14 if you wish. Please have your work wired, framed, and ready for hanging. No saw tooth hangers or clip mountings will be accepted.

Entries must be original 2 or 3 dimensional work, including but not limited to painting, photography, drawing, and sculpture and should be inspired by a scenic location in the Farmington Valley (Avon, Canton, Farmington, Granby, Simsbury, New Hartford etc.). You will be asked on the entry form to designate the location that inspired you. All works will be juried for entry and awards.

3D artists are limited to **(2) entries**. Free - standing art must stand on a base of no greater than 18" x 18" and be no taller than 6'. Sculpture on pedestals must sit on a pedestal no bigger than 18" x 18". Please provide your own pedestals. Jewelry or similar items must include a presentation case or display, and consist of no more than **(3) entries per artist**.

A **non-refundable fee of \$20** is charged for **one entry, \$25 for two, and \$30 for three**. Artists over 60 pay a fee discounted by \$5 in each category. Please make checks payable to "Granby Land Trust."

About Juror Frank Federico

Frank Federico is a seasoned artist with many credits garnishing his career. He has attained the honorable level of signature membership in numerous prestigious art societies including, Master Pastellist Pastel Society of America, National Watercolor Society, Pastel Society of Painters on Cape Cod and Degas Pastel Society, to name a few. He has received numerous awards including the Grumbacher Gold, Silver and Bronze, many honors from the Pastel Society of America, National Society of Painters in Casein & Acrylic, Allied Artists of America and many more. Mr. Federico conducts workshops domestically and abroad, and teaches regularly for the West Hartford Art League. His paintings have been exhibited in group and solo exhibitions in Florida, California, New Mexico, New Orleans, LA, all across New England, and in Brunei, Stockholm and Tokyo. His work is currently represented by Elaine Beckwith Gallery in Jamaica, VT, PS Gallery in Litchfield, CT, and Gregory James Gallery in New Milford, CT.

"I believe that art is as capricious as nature's own whims. It is as permanent as the endless striving for universal harmony, but in a constant flux. My technique is varied with mood and empathy for the subject matter or motif. Nature provides the catalyst – human or otherwise – with this constant flux of rhythms, shapes and boundless energy. Each painting speaks for itself and has a life of its own. I am the stoker of the energy, the catalyzer."

Beginning at 9:00 AM, highly respected artist and educator Frank Federico will lead a discussion for the artists gathered for the Paint Out focusing on the rigors of *plein aire* painting and the opportunities presented by the landscape of the beautiful Johnson property whose development rights have been donated to GLT. The artists will then spread out to begin working. Throughout the morning, Mr. Federico will be visiting with the artists to talk with them about their work, offering guidance and suggestions. All Land Trust visitors are invited to join Frank as he shares his insights garnered through years of painting and teaching.

Following lunch, we are very pleased to present Melanie Anderson Bourbeau, Associate Curator and Collections Manager of the Hill-Stead Museum who will speak about the Monet *plein aire* paintings in their collection. Melanie received her M.A. in American Studies from Trinity College, Hartford, CT and has worked at numerous museums in Greater Hartford including The Mark Twain House and Museum, The Noah Webster House and the Austin House, a museum operated by the Wadsworth Atheneum Museum of Art.
